WARNING

- DO NOT USE THE PASTA POT OR GLASS LID IN THE OVEN. Not oven, dishwasher or microwave safe.
- Use care when using the glass lid. As with any glassware for cooking, the lid could
- break due to sudden temperature changes or impact if it is dropped or knocked against a hard object. - DO NOT apply sudden force to the glass lid, as it may shatter.
- DO NOT directly expose the glass lid to a burner or other source of heat.
- Allow lid to cool before washing.
- DO NOT allow damp fabric to contact the lid when the lid is hot.
- Wash by hand. Do not put in dishwasher.
- Avoid sudden temperature changes to lid.
- DO NOT put lid under faucet or in wet sink when it is hot.
- Immediately stop using the lid if the lid cracks, chips, or becomes badly scratched. - DO NOT attempt to repair lid if it is chipped or cracked.
- DO NOT remove dried food from the lid with sharp or metal utensils as the lid may
- get damaged.
- Be careful when handling broken glass because the pieces may be extremely small - Always use care when handling hot cookware to avoid potential injury. Lid might
- become hot during prolonged cooking.
- Use oven mitts or pot holders when lifting the lid or the cookware. - This product is for home use only. It is not intended for camping or commercial use.
- Monitor cookware during use to avoid potential injury to children or the risk of fire.
- Although the handles lock onto the lid, the weight of cooked contents and liquids vary, so always hold your thumbs down on the handles when draining the pot.


- Hot liquids can cause serious injury. Before commencing use, carefully read all

- the instructions. Escaping steam can cause severe burns. Do not lift the lid on a boiling pot suddenly.
- Always tilt it open away from you so that the steam escapes harmlessly. Remember to use potholders. - To prevent escaping steam or hot liquid from scalding you, ensure that the lid is firmly locked.
- Always lift the pot with the handles located on the sides, never lift by using the handle located on the lid. - Use potholders if handles become hot during cooking.
- Make sure that the handle does not jut out from the stove, to prevent the pot from being toppled over.
- Select appropriate sized burner. Flame size should cover only the bottom of the pot and not extend outside.
- From time to time, check for loose handles. Tighten screws if found to be loose. If the handles are riveted or welded to the pot, do not attempt to tighten.




